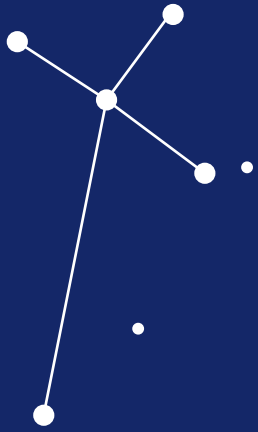
Can you identify star constellations?

On the next page you will see a constellation map. See if you can identify any of these constellations.



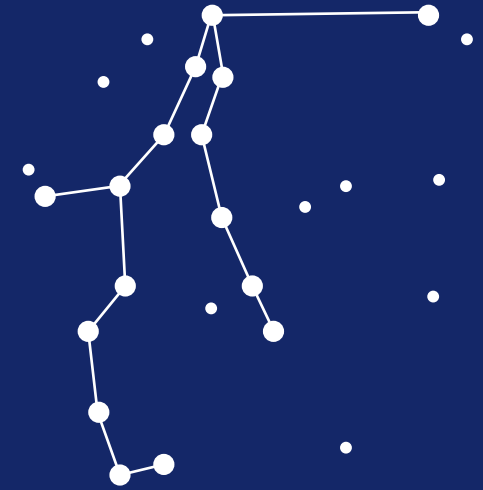

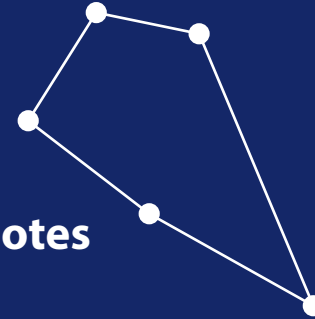
